Trout in the Classroom Trout Release 2023

On March 21, SRTU Chapter assisted Dan River Basin Association (DRBA) in the first trout release of 2023 for Hope Academy Greensboro 6th graders. The release was held at the Smith River Great Road Canoe Access, Fieldale, Virginia.

Hope Academy is a private, community-funded, non-profit school serving South Greensboro, NC. The academy enrollment is for kindergarten thru 8th grade.

After arrival at the release site, students participated in a group search for aquatic invertebrates, crustaceans, mollusks, and fish using a kick-seine net.



Krista Hodges, DRBA Education Outreach Manager, gives students an informative and entertaining presentation on the Smith River's aquatic residents and trout food.



Each student is given a cup with fingerling trout to release. Trout are given names by the students and gently released into the river. After a few minutes acclimating to the 45 degree water temperature, trout zoom off for deeper safer waters.

As described on the TU website, the Southeastern TU regional rendezvous was an occasion to be inspired – by the work of TU staff, lessons from volunteer leaders, and conversations with friends. The meeting was an excellent opportunity to discuss the issues facing the region as well as a chance to network and build relationships with fellow TU volunteer leaders and TU staff.

The weekend was packed with informed guest speakers at eight “all attendee” sessions and on Saturday, eighteen smaller breakout sessions. Presentation topics varied from conservation practices to Chapter level strategic planning. For example, the Saturday morning welcome address topic was about the Great Smokey Mountain National Park Partnerships in Brook Trout Restoration.

The author attended the following Saturday breakout sessions:

- An overview of Native Brook Trout Conservation Efforts in North Carolina
- Creating Effective Business Partnerships and Hosting Fun Events
- Ten Years of Native Trout: Learning how to Conserve and Restore Brook Trout in the Southern Appalachians
- Working at a watershed scale – the Alarka Headwaters Project, NC
- A Look at Private Land and Water Conservation Through the Eyes of a Young Steward

Saturday evening was filled with an auction, raffle, and dinner with Keynote speaker Reynolds Wolf from The Weather Channel. Reynolds is an avid fly angler fishing at least once a week. He packs a fly rod wherever he travels and takes advantage of the weather forecast to choose prime fishing days. He praised and thanked TU staff and volunteers for our conservation efforts.



Philpott Dam Repairs Update

At the March chapter meeting Chris Powell, Philpott Operations Project Manager with the Army Corps of Engineers was our guest speaker. Chris was joined by Steve Jones and Tyler Carter to discuss the current status of repairs to the Philpott Dam power generation machinery.



After a week of heavy rainfall in May 2020 a landslide along the slope above the switchgear building caused major damage to the remaining generator and destroyed the switchgear outbuilding.



Since then neither generator has been operational. After a detailed review proposals for repairs to the generators and replacement of the switch building were submitted and have been approved. With federal funding earmarked work has begun moving forward. Initial work has included removal of the existing turbines and generator equipment with replacement equipment already in the process of being built.

While the new equipment is being built solutions are being reviewed for stabilization of the hillside. This may include large scale removal of dirt down to the rock. Once the hillside is stabilized replacement of the generator equipment can move forward. The new generators currently being built are more efficient with increased flows possible. Chris was able to provide an expected schedule plan for the repairs
